



Identify and Respond to Child Abuse and Neglect (CR.007297)

To provide learners with the knowledge and understanding of the complexity, types, indicators and impacts of child abuse, neglect and cumulative harm that can happen to children and young people. Learn how to respond, record and report these concerns to the Department of Communities.

Target group:

Departmental Staff, Partner Agency Staff, and Carers.

Learning Outcomes:

1. Examine the current context of Child Protection nationally and state-wide.
2. Identify Abuse Types, and physical and behavioural indicators of child abuse and neglect.
3. Explore vulnerabilities to risk of harm based on factors such as age, gender, disability, and culture.
4. Recognise the consequent impact of abuse in the short and long term.
5. Develop an understanding of how to manage, respond, record, and report a concern for a child, or a disclosure of abuse.
6. Identify the Importance of staff wellbeing to strengthen resilience.
