



FDV: Risk Assessment and Multi-agency Management

Family and Domestic Violence: Risk Assessment and Multi-agency Management (2 day course) (CR.007347)

Aim:

To apply the Western Australian Common Risk Assessment and Risk Management Framework (CRARMF) as part of an effective integrated response to people experiencing family and domestic violence. This includes applying the minimum standards and practice requirements for family and domestic violence screening, risk assessment, risk management, information sharing, perpetrator accountability and referral within a multi-agency case management context.

Target group:

This course is for professionals who undertake FDV comprehensive risk assessments. For staff in the FDV system: in early intervention (mainstream services) and tertiary intervention (FDV hub practitioners, statutory child protection, partner agencies and FDV refuges).

Learning Outcomes

1. Access, interpret and use screening and risk assessment procedures and tools to identify family and domestic violence and respond to the risk of harm.
2. Assess vulnerabilities to determine their impact on child and adult victim safety, family functioning and wellbeing.
3. Partner with adult victim to make a personal safety plan and implement safety planning.
4. Use multi-agency case management guidelines to partner with adult victims, intervene for perpetrator accountability and increase victim safety and wellbeing.
