Recognise and Respond to Family and Domestic Violence (CR.007356)

Aim:

This course assists learners to recognise forms, indicators, and family and domestic violence (FDV) dynamics, and to respond to the needs of clients who may be experiencing FDV. This includes responding to immediate intervention and support needs within the limitations of worker’s role and responsibilities.

Target group:

This course is for Communities staff, partner agencies and the community services sector in Western Australia, who may not be specialised family violence workers.

It is for employees intersect with family and domestic violence within their work, or who work directly with individuals, families, and the community in family and domestic violence **early intervention services**.



Learning Outcomes

1. Adopt work practices that support interactions with those affected by family violence
2. Identify client needs, adult-victim strengths and indications of risk and threats to safety
3. Respond to client needs: vulnerable individuals and groups in the community
4. Identify and analyse perpetrator patterns of behaviour and the intersection with factors that increase risk, urgency, and complexity.
5. Apply common risk assessment and risk management tools to maximise client and worker safety in accordance with work role and workplace policy.
